

# Tracking climate action with IATI

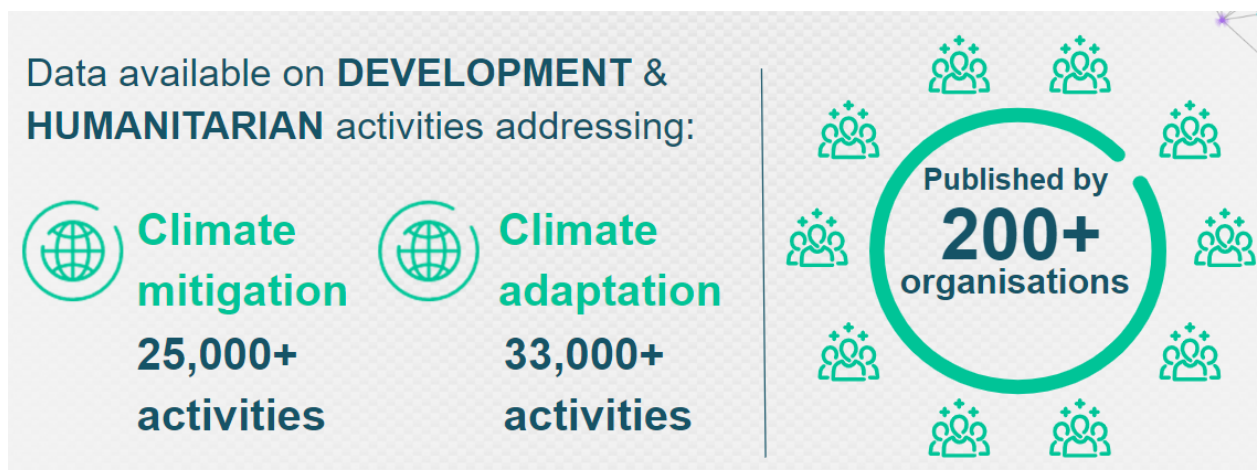

## What is IATI?

The International Aid Transparency Initiative (IATI) is a global initiative to **improve** the **transparency** of development and humanitarian resources and results. IATI encourages organisations that address international poverty and crises to publish open data about their funding and activities according to the IATI Standard. This is a set of rules for sharing development and humanitarian data in a way that is accessible and comparable. Once IATI data is published, it is free and open for anyone to access online.

IATI is funded by more than 100 development organisations and a Governing Board of representatives drawn from member organisations. The IATI Secretariat is hosted by UNDP, working closely with technology partners and a wide community of data publishers and users.

## What data is available on climate action?



As of 30 November 2023, IATI data is available from **219** organisations who marked their development and humanitarian activities as targeting climate change mitigation and/or adaptation. There are **33,340<sup>1</sup>** activities marked as targeting **climate adaptation** and **25,353<sup>2</sup>** marked as targeting **climate mitigation**.

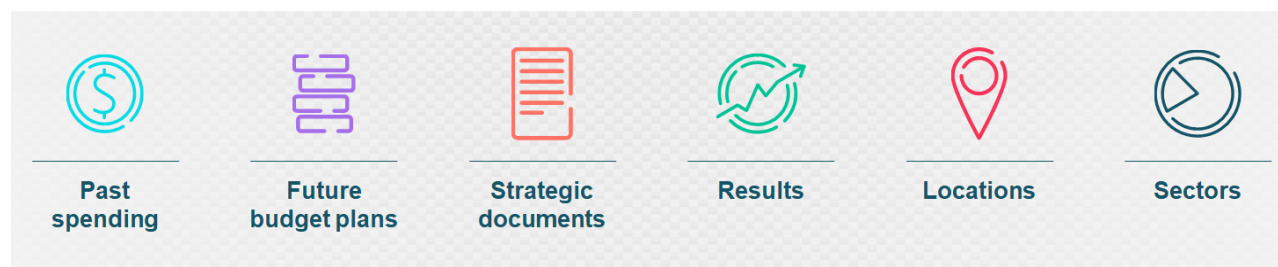

## What types of data can be found?

In addition to policy markers, the IATI Standard enables organisations to publish a wide range of information including financial data, strategic documents, project locations and results achieved.



## Start exploring IATI data using our online tools:

- [d-portal.org](https://d-portal.org) - one of simplest ways of searching IATI data. Here you can search specifically for activities targeting climate mitigation and / or adaptation by selecting them from the filter called 'Policy Marker'.
- [County Development Finance Data Tool](#) (CDFD) - great for visualising and analysing development finance published to IATI data by country / region.
- [IATI Datastore](#) - undertake more complex searches of IATI data. Query ALL data fields published in the IATI Standard. API available.
