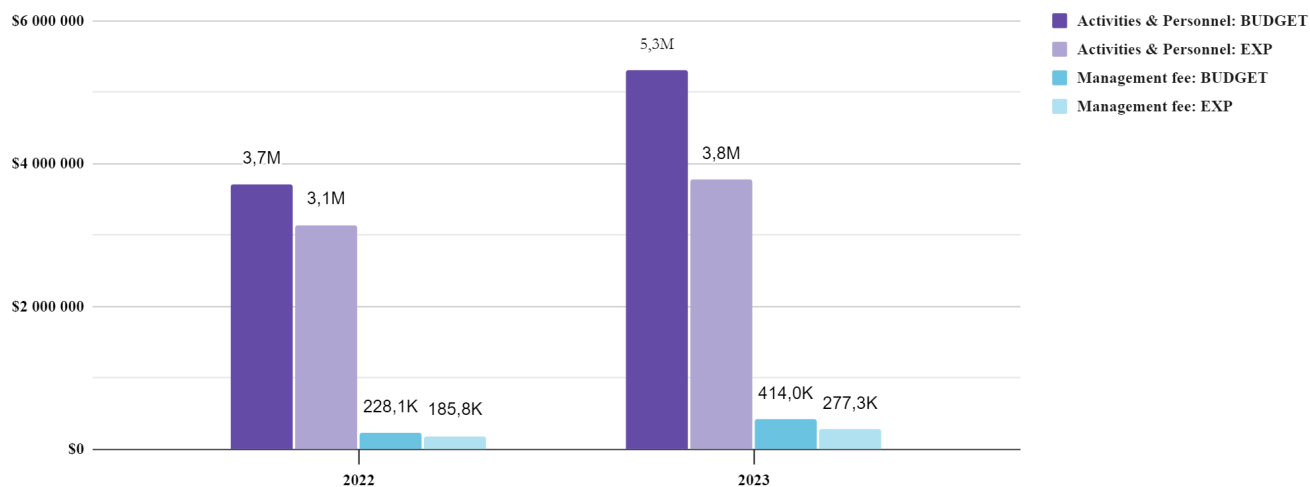

Project Expenditure and Budget trend from 2022-2023

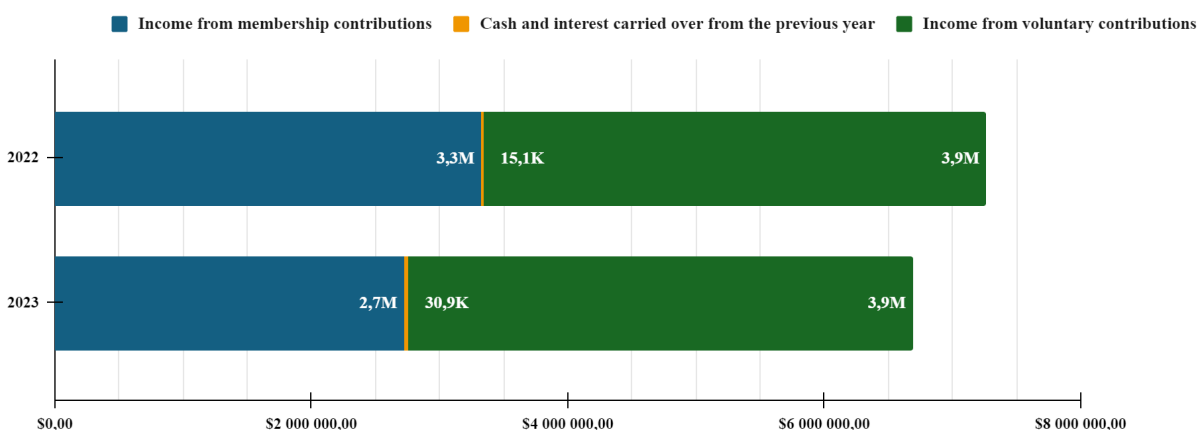


1.3 IATI Income 2022 compared to 2023

In comparison with 2022, income from membership contribution decreased in 2023 due partly to the fact that some members paid their dues for 2021 in the implementing year of 2022, which resulted in record income in the latter year. Additionally, a number of members did not pay their Y10 membership contribution during 2023, and are expected to pay it in 2024, in the total amount of \$379,600. 2.1 Original Budget 2023 compared to Budget revision in September 2023

The Governing Board approved two budget revisions in 2023, in May and September, resulting in an overall increase from \$2,306,838 to \$5,729,643.
